Remedy claimed or sought:

- 1. FTI Consulting Canada Inc. in its capacity as Court-appointed Receiver (the **Receiver**) of the current and future assets, undertakings and properties of Twin Butte Energy Ltd. (**Twin Butte**) seeks the following relief:
 - a. abridging, if necessary, the time for service of this Application and supporting materials, and declaring service of same to be good and sufficient; and
 - b. an Order, substantially in the form attached hereto as **Schedule "A"**, authorizing the Receiver to make an interim distribution (the **Interim Distribution**) out of the assets of Twin Butte in the approximate amount of \$68,214,223 to certain unsecured creditors of Twin Butte having Proven Claims as such term is defined the Claims Procedure Order dated May 1, 2017 in the within proceedings.

Grounds for making this application:

Interim Distribution and Holdback of Funds

- 2. The unsecured creditors of Twin Butte to whom distributions are proposed to be made all have Proven Claims as against the Twin Butte estate.
- 3. The Interim Distribution is just, appropriate, and in the best interests of the administration of the receivership estate.
- 4. The Receiver intends on retaining a holdback of funds in the amount of approximately \$14,535,371 in respect of:
 - a. the claim asserted by GeoCap Energy Corporation and Sutton Energy Ltd. (GeoCap/Sutton), which is presently being assessed by the Receiver;
 - b. the claim asserted by CEP LP Investment Corp;
 - c. the claim asserted by a former executive and a former employee whose claims are the subject of applications before this Honourable Court;
 - d. claims that remain under review by the Receiver, including the tax claims of Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada as represented by the Minister of National Revenue and the Alberta Treasury Board and Minister of Finance; and
 - e. contingencies and other unforeseen expenses that may arise in respect of the administration of the receivership estate.
- 5. Such further and other grounds as counsel may advise and this Honourable Court may permit.

Declaration Regarding "Interest Stops" Rule

- 6. One of the unsecured creditors of Twin Butte is Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada as represented by the Minister of National Revenue (CRA) in respect of unpaid income taxes.
- 7. The CRA's claim as filed includes claims for penalties and interest. The "interest stops" rule under section 122(2) of the *Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act* precludes any claim for interest from the date of the receivership, and applies to unsecured claims in non-bankruptcy insolvency proceedings.

8. The non-payment of post-receivership interest amounts for unsecured tax claims would be consistent with the Receiver's distributions to other unsecured creditors.

SERVICE

2. The Receiver is hereby authorized and directed to make distributions in the amount of \$68,344,233 in accordance with the proposed initial distributions described in paragraphs 27-36 of the Tenth Report.

DECLARATION REGARDING INTEREST STOPS

3. Section 122(2) of the Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act, R.S.C., 1985, c. B-3, applies to all unsecured creditors of Twin Butte including Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada as represented by the Minister of National Review (CRA), such that claims for payment of interest accrued and owing after September 1, 2016, including the claim for unpaid interest asserted by the CRA, are disallowed.
