  - (i) the total tonnage mined or produced during the previous calendar year or any part thereof includ in the term:
  - (ii) the concentrates obtained from the total tonnage mined or preduced:
  - (iii) the average metal content of minerals and concentrates produced or processed during the year.;
  - (iv) the places of sale of all products of the mine;
  - (v) the total number of men employed;
  - (vi) the total wages and salaries paid during the year;
  - (vii) the gross value received from the sale of all minerals and concentrates; and
  - (viii) all other data and information whatsoever as may b required by the Lessor.
- 6. That the Lessee will permit the Lessor by its agents at all reasonable times to enter upon and inspect and examine the mine or mines and premises and every part thereof for the purpose of ascertaining the condition thereof and the manner of

That the Lessee will maintain throughout the term herein granted good and sufficient corner posts or mounds and boundary marks according to the most approved mining practice for the time being adopted in similar mines and fields and in accordance with The Crown Lands (Mines and Quarries) Act, chapter 175 of The Revised Statutes of Newfoundland, 1952.
- 8. That except where it is necessary to employ technical experts the Lessee shall at all times in the working and production of the minerals employ Newfoundland workmen if they are available.
- 9. That if the Lessor shall at any time be desirous of acquiring any vacant lands, being part of the demised premises, for the purpose of building, making or erecting railways, roads, bridges or public buildings or works or for townsites or for agricultural settlements, or for sites for tourist purposes the Lessee shall, if it has not carried out or is not proposing to carry out development thereon, release such lands to the Lessor and if the Lessee or its assignees or transferses have improved such lands they shall be surrendered upon payment by the Lessor of fair and reasonable compensation to be agreed upon between the parties and if not agreed upon to be settled by arbitration in the manner provided in Section 8I of The Newfoundland and Labrador Corporatio Limited Act, 1951, the Act No. 88 of 1951 as amended by The Newfoundland and Labrador Corporation Limited (Amendment) Act, 1953, the Act No. 64 of 1953.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Lease, if the amount of any rents payable in any year under this Indenture or the performance or observance of any covenant or condition contained in this Indenture is in dispute between the Lessor and the Lessee, such rents shall be deemed due and payable and such covenant or condition shall be deemed to be performed or observed within sixty days of the date of the award of the arbitrators appointed to decide such dispute in accordance with Clause 7 of this part of this Indenture: Provided that the Less shall not be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless it ha paid the amount which it considers is payable in respect of such rents within thirty days of the date upon which the said rents are payable and provided further that if the full amount of such rents payable under the said award shall not be paid within the said sixty days after the date of such award then the Lessor may exercise the rights conferred on it by Clause 4 of this part of this Indenture and the Lessor shall not be obliged to give the notice required thereby.
- 6. That should the mining operations of the Lessee cause subsidence of or other injury to the surface land of the demised premises, the Lessee shall not be liable to pay any compensation therefor to the Lessor.
- 7. That if any dispute, question or difference shall arise at an time between the Lessor and the Lessee as to any matter contained in this Indenture or touching or concerning the provisions of this Indenture or the construction, meaning, operation or effect there or arising out of or in relation to this Indenture then such

dispute, question or difference shall be determined by arbitration in manner following:

The Lessor shall appoint one arbitrator, the Lessee shall appoint another, and the two arbitrators so appointed shall appoint a third or umpire, and in the event of the Lessor or th Lessee failing to appoint an arbitrator after seven clear days' notice by the Lessor or the Lessee, as the case may be, so to d the Lessor or the Lessee may apply to the Supreme Court or a Ju thereof, who may after due notice to the Lessor or the Lessee a the case may be, appoint such arbitrator, and the arbitrators s appointed by the Lessor or the Lessee and by the Court or Judge shall thereupon appoint a third arbitrator or umpire, and in t event of the last mentioned arbitrators failing to appoint a th arbitrator or umpire after seven clear days' notice from the Lessor or the Lesses so to do, the Supreme Court or a Judge thereof may, on the application of the Lessor or the Lessoe, as the case may be, appoint such third arbitrator or umpire, and b award of such arbitrator or any two of them shall be final and binding upon the parties.

- 9. That the Lessee may at any time assign the Lease hereby granted or any interest of the Lessee therein by written assignment for such prices or other considerations and upon and subject to such terms and conditions as the Lessee deems proper
- 10. Where the Lessee has brought a mine into production in the demised area the demised area shall revert to the Lessor if the mines has ceased to operate for ten consecutive years.
- 11. All the terms and provisions of The Newfoundland and

Labrador Corporation Limited Act, 1951, the Act No. 88 of 1951, as amended by The Newfoundland and Labrador Corporation Limited (Amendment) Act, 1953, the Act No. 64 of 1953, shall be and are hereby made part and parcel of this Indenture and should anythin, herein conflict with The Newfoundland and Labrador Corporation Limited Act, 1951, as amended, the said Act shall prevail and the Lessee hereby covenants to abide by the terms and provisions of the said Act.




## SCHEDULE
